The Joelette_® is a one person seat mounted on one wheel, all-terrain, that requires 2 handlers, opening the way to people with reduced mobility to places of difficult access.

There are many beautiful areas in Costa Rica, from mountain trails to rainforest paths or simply some isolated beach, beautiful national parks, yet inaccessible to many people, being a handicapped, a grandma or an elderly tourist.

How many "seniors" visit Costa Rica each year, how many of them have turned down the jungle walk option offered to them for not being able anymore to walk a mile on uneven floor?

The Joelette permits the access to these various attractions to people who never dreamed of making it reality.

Presentation:

- The Joelette opens the way to many different terrains such as beach or desert, mountains, forests or steep trails.
- For being on one wheel only, the Joelette allows transiting on the most narrow or rocky walkways.
- Equipped with especially thought breaks and shocks for a safe and comfortable ride.
- The seat is comfortable with a head-rest, arm-rests and foot-rest, all adjustable.
- Seat-belt.
- The Joelette is very stable and well balanced while in still position.
- Its transport and storage is easy, due to its removable arms and practical dimensions



Features:

- Allows reaching places of interest inaccessible to many people until now, for different reasons.
- Allows the access of tourists to unreachable or just tiring attractions
- Easy handling
- The Joelette's limits are the helpers/handlers's.

Technique of use:

The principle is to balance the weight of the rider on the one wheel, the handlers' role being only to push, pull and guide the movement.

Rear handler / duty:

- to assure the balance front/rear of the Joelette, helped by the adjustable arms
- to help push forward with the help of an abdominal strap
- to control the breaks

Front handler / duty:

- to assure the traction by pulling forward, helped by a shoulder strap
- to guide the Joelette with the help of ergonomic arms

The flexibility of adaptation of the Joelette allows a comfortable use for the rider as well as for the handlers.

History:

- The first model was hand-made by Joel Claudel in France.
- The concept for the first industrialized series followed all established international criteria for the physically challenged.
- Today, the Joelette has proven its amazing capacities with many people, on many different terrains.
